



Spare a thought for the Op shop staff who have been working hard as the numbers of visitors to the shop swell during the holiday season, not to mention the piles of donations having to be sorted and priced as people clean out their cupboards in their free time. Apparently, it gets worse when the kids go back to school with parents cleaning out the surplus stuff! Other factors come into play too – some of the volunteers are carers for grandchildren in the school holidays while parents work – and some are away enjoying a holiday, meaning the Op Shop is currently short staffed. So they have reluctantly stopped taking donations until some of the backlog is cleared. Doesn't stop dumping though. One of their peeves is people who don't sort their donations – meaning a lot of the stuff is unsaleable and has to be put in the skip – thus increasing our expenses.

Manager Bryn is on hand every day and supporting all the volunteers appropriately. Bryn said there was a huge demand for the donated food which is now "rationed" to 5 items per person (on a voluntary basis) as well as there being a 7 km radius for donations, so the food goes to people within that area only. Sadly, there were some people out of the area who were not deserving taking advantage of the free food. By and large people are very thankful for the assistance that the food bank provides.

Volunteer Andrea who retired from Health Care work was a regular customer of the Op Shop and joined the volunteer group a few months ago. She said she was amazed at the workings of the op shop and did not realize what went on behind the scenes. She loves the work and was hard at it in the sorting room when visited. It's wonderful for our club to have such dedicated volunteers working so hard.
