Tuesday November 29th is Rotary Foundation Giving Day and all Clubs have been asked to support the Foundation. We have already put in place a budget to support the Foundation.



Leanne and Laura talked about The Warrandyte Refugee Support Group which is made up of six local people who are all volunteers under the leadership of Hahn Truong. They have all undergone training with CRISP (see 3rd slide).

The aim of the group is to integrate a refugee family into the local community by providing hands on support to get them on their feet to the point where they can be relatively independent.

The Myanmar family of 5 (parents and 3 children aged 9, 6 and 4) has arrived in Melbourne after having spent ten years in a refugee camp in Malaysia. They are in short term accommodation and will be moving to Warrandyte to longer term accommodation in the next week. The Refugee Support Group has made contact with the family and are looking forward to assisting with the myriad of documentation and practical issues confronting the family. The group members have various skill sets so that individuals will take on specific tasks to help the family e.g. one member will handle all the applications for Centrelink and Medicare etc., others will help with English Language, getting the children into school, driving licenses, shopping, setting up their home and so on. They have been granted sub class 200 humanitarian visas which enables them to work.

The group needs to fund raise and it is expected and hoped that more refugee families will follow with the same scheme in the future so this fund will be ongoing. There have already been some fundraising functions which have been well attended but funds will be needed as they go forward. They have been in touch with our Op Shop which should be a good source of items they may need for their home. Luckily the house they are renting is fully furnished.

It was very interesting and we hope that it works out for all concerned with the family ultimately becoming independent and fully integrated into Australian life. We look forward to hearing from the group in the future about their progress.

What is CRISP?

Community Refugee Integration Settlement Pilot

- Programme created by the partnering of Federal Government and Community Refugee Sponsorship Australia (CRSA)
- Commenced in Australia in May 2022
- August 2022 the first Syrian families arrived under CRISP. Settled in Gosford and Wonthaggi
- Families are referred to the programme by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. Families have links to Australia
- Community Refugee Sponsorship has been running in Canada for over 40years allowing over 300K refugees to be settled. The programme is now also available in UK, Spain Germany and Argentina
- Australia aims to settle over 1500 over the next 3 years via CRISP
- Community led holistic programme engaging entire community for the resettlement of a refugee family
- CRSA Training- completed and Settlement Plan underway
- Fundraising- Trivia Night, Morning Tea, Online Auction, NaNY donations, Music Event, and soon to come an Author Talk and a Tamil Feast
- > Housing- short & long term accommodation has been found
- > House Furnishings- donations being sought, rest will be purchased
- Community awareness- through events and social media
- > Settlement- integration into our community lead by everyday locals
- Support- ongoing for 12 months since their arrival in Australia and the possibility of supporting future families

SUPPORT

WRSG is required to fundraise sufficient funds to allow a family of 3-4 to settle in Australia, we need all the help of our Community to make this happen.
