We had a short presentation from Steve McDonald, Chair of the District Conference Committee who gave us a run-down of the conference coming up in 2 weeks' time. There is a great line up of guest speakers and it is the cheapest conference ever at \$140 per head plus \$100 for the gala dinner on Saturday night. I do hope we can get some members there. Had we been available we would certainly have attended, the first in person conference for two years.



We also welcomed Lana Bedford the new Manager at the Warrandyte Neighbourhood House who has been in the job for 2 weeks. Lana lives in Warrandyte and had previously been managing a Community House in Sunshine, so she is much relieved at not having to travel out that far from home every day. She is looking forward to working with the local community in establishing programs that fit the community needs.

Lana said there are 440 Neighbourhood Houses in

Victoria and everyone is different according to the community it serves. Neighbourhood Houses developed out of the Women's movement in the latter part of the last century, and they have all evolved according to the local needs, and are ever changing. Many of them have

programs directed at assisting new migrants and women in particular, to develop skills they might use to make money to help their families. Lana said it is important for the "houses" to communicate and collaborate with the people they are wanting to assist so that the programs are geared to what the people want not what the staff/volunteers think they should have. (this sounds very much like Rotary programs today).

One of their aims today is to reduce the high level of loneliness in the community – something that Covid lockdowns have brought to the fore. WNH is well placed to address this by connecting people through its various classes and programs.

Neighbourhood Houses get some funding from local governments and various grants, and the funding is complicated but necessary to enable the houses to provide quality programs. Recently the WNH has had its local government funding cut by 40% which puts it in a difficult situation.

We look forward to continuing our partnership and contact with the WNH through continuous

dialogue.

Good luck to Marg George whose hospital admission was put back a week – she will be in hospital next Tuesday hoping to set her back right.

There was discussion around the table about our venue and the possibility of having to change our meeting nights if a venue cannot accommodate us on a Tuesday. Rob


