<u>Leanne Liao – "Life as an Expatriate".</u>



Leanne was born in China and came to Australia with her family when she was about 12 years of age. She went to school here then attended Monash University and studied Information Technology. She worked as a Programmer at Knight Ridder then became a "stay at home mum" when her two daughters were born.

She and her family then found themselves expatriates in Vietnam as her husband worked for the French Company Danone. She was very lonely at first, couldn't speak the language, but soon found some other Chinese

speakers who introduced her to the many groups and clubs for expatriate partners. Through these she made a lot of friends and became involved with various activities with the groups.

Since then she and her family have lived in Malaysia, the Philippines and China as expatriates from Australia. Leanne's husband is now working in Guang Zhou, China. Covid 19 has meant Leanne has spent the past year in Australia rather than Guang Zhou, separated from her husband
