Warrnambool was windy and cold but the conference had some interesting and inspiring speakers. The theme was Mental Health, so all the speakers were in some way connected to this theme. One was Arnold Dix, and Aussie engineer who helped rescue 41 workers who were trapped for 17 days after a landslide in Nepal last year. The workers were not expected to come out alive due to the difficult terrain and the nature of the landslide itself, but



they persevered, went very slowly and finally succeeded in getting them all out via a narrow pipe. Arnold was determined to pay respects to the gods of the mountain which is the custom in Nepal and he felt that it played a role in the outcome.

The other outstanding speaker was Tom Boyd former AFL player who was drafted to G W Sydney straight out of school – he moved interstate and began his footy career but struggled to cope in his first season. It was put down to homesickness – so eventually he was traded to the Western Bulldogs. On coming home to Melbourne, he thought his problems would be solved by having familiar surroundings and supports but his anxiety and insomnia heightened to the point where he was so fatigued he was continually injured. He eventually made the decision to quit football if he was to gain happiness in his life.

The RIPPR (Rotary International President Personal Representative) was Harash L Ramchanddani from RC of Jamaica and he was a ripper of a RIPPR – very entertaining and a great speaker.

Past International President Ian Risley gave, over the two days an overview of some of District 9810s Clubs' outstanding projects, by way of acknowledging the work of clubs in the District, now that District 9810 will be no longer.


