She worked as a Community Development Officer with the Melbourne City Mission for many years in homelessness and addiction programs. She also worked with schools to help students who were not attending school with the city of Boroondara for seven years. She spent time working with Manningham Youth Services – so she is well connected and has a wealth of community experience.

The emphasis at the Warrandyte Neighborhood House today is Good Health and Wellbeing – helping people to maintain their good health and connections.

The House is developing and supporting programs such as the L to P with Manningham City Council – helping young people develop good driving skills and gain their P plates. They are holding a series of Community Conversations to address topics such as Understanding Anxiety, LGBTIQA, Identifying Neurodivergence in children and young people – these sessions will involve skilled and experienced practitioners whose focus is in improving overall health and wellbeing.

They plan to hold a Warrandyte Big Lunch in conjunction with other groups such as Lions and our Rotary Club.

As well as the above the WNH has a comprehensive list of regular classes as well as clubs such as Book Club, Warrandyte Walkers, Warrandyte Trippers, French Club and Busy Needles, 500 Card Club, and Film Society. They also have a food pantry in conjunction with CareNet - food relief for those in need.

So all in all the Warrandyte Neighborhood House fills a huge need in the community by connecting people and providing affordable and interesting programs for all ages.

Like every group the WNH is seeking people to take on board positions to keep their programs going.

It was very interesting to hear Vanessa's talk and we look forward to helping with the Big Lunch, the first of which will be held on 16th October.

The pilot is really gathering some momentum now.

As stated, the Pilot's main goal is to find ways to more effectively and efficiently support you and your club to increase impact, grow membership, and adapt to changing volunteer needs and expectations.

News this month concerns the election of the Regional Council and the structure and

operation of Community Groups.

Governance across the zone will be overseen by a Regional Council elected by clubs. The Regional Council will be led by a Chair who will be supported by a Chair-Elect, with each serving two-year terms.

As Rotarians and Rotaractors of Rotary Districts participating in the Regionalisation Pilot, you will soon be able to apply for the Regional Council positions of Chair, Chair-Elect and Portfolio Leads. Only Rotaractors can apply to be the Rotaract Nominee. The role descriptions for these positions are now available on the Creating Tomorrow website here.

From 1 July 2024 the proposed regional model includes a new way of grouping clubs, with each group of clubs referred to as a 'Rotary Community Group'. By working together, clubs can support each other to increase their impact, amplify Rotary's public image, and strengthen member engagement.
