THE ROTARY CLUBS of Templestowe, Warrandyte Donvale, and Manningham Rotaract organised an Australia Day lunch at Doncaster Shoppingtown Hotel.

They received a grant from the National Australia Day Council to help run the event, enabling representatives and clients of community groups to join them as guests.

The event was organised to recognise the contribution of community groups in our area, to show respect for all Australians, to unite Australians, and to celebrate what it is to be an Australian. Invitees enjoyed a two-course meal and some wonderful entertainment from the Rosewood Trio, along with some video linkage to Rotary guest speakers and additional entertainment from notable Australians such as Marina Prior.

The event was a huge success with 159 people joining in the celebration, 105 from community groups and 54 Rotarians and partners.

Warrandyte Riverside Market

It was very interesting to hear how the Warrandyte Riverside Market has flourished over the 4-5 years it has been in operation as WRM.

It's genesis was from the the original Warrandyte Market which the Manningham Council put out to tender, intending that it would be a community operation involving various not- for-profit community groups. So the CFA, Community Church, Lions, Rotary and Warrandyte Community Association got together and formed the working committee. Today it is



professionally managed under licence from the Manningham Council with the five organisations providing the manpower to manage it on the day of operation and each organisation has one member of the committee of management.

There are over 2000 stall holders on the wait list, which is quite staggering, and a good position to be in. Greg vets potential new stall holders so there are not too many of the same thing, and is always looking for new and novel stalls.

It has been listed as one of the top four riverside markets in Australia which is a wonderful accolade. It has a faithful following and we found out that many people use the various bus routes through Warrandyte to get there because parking is such a problem. The market length includes four bus stops in Yarra Street so it is easy to get to for bus commuters coming from either direction from Eltahm, The Pines and Ringwood Station.

We consider ourselves very lucky to be part of such a successful operation which has a rich history in the local area and is so sought after by stall holders. By and large the feedback from the guys who do the set up in the early hours of the morning marshalling stall holders is that most are fantastic and appreciative of what we do. The atmosphere is relaxed and there is something at the market for everyone. It's a great day out.

Many thanks to Greg for sparing the time to come to our meeting. Rob Edwards presented Greg with a Certificate of Appreciation and "sustainable" Rotaray plant as a thankyou.


