Guest Speaker:

David Tynan has lived in Warrandyte for 15 years and is a teacher at St Aquinas College in Ringwood.

David is the coordinator of the Warrandyte Repair Café, which has been operating since July 2019 in

the Mechanics Institute Hall on the 1st Sunday of every month.

Repair Cafes are a world wide activity and were started in The Netherlands in 2009 by Martine Postama. There are now 3000 all over the world, 66 in Australia, 32 in Victoria and 10 in Melbourne.

The venue at the Mechanics Instsitute Hall is fortuitous because of an interesting fact. Did you know that the hall is owned by all people who live 2 miles from the Warrandyte Post Office (by some ancient local decree!). Which means the MIH can make it's own decisions.

It was a really interesting talk and showcases another fabulous local initiative.

What is a Repair Café?



- Repair Cafés are free meeting places and they're all about repairing things (together) and reducing waste and landfill.
- In the place where a Repair Café is located, you'll find experts, tools and materials to help make repairs you need.
- We fix clothes, furniture, electrical appliances, crockery, books, toys, et cetera.
- Visitors bring their broken items from home. Together with the specialists they start making their repairs in the Repair Café.



• It's an ongoing learning process. Sometimes advice is the best thing.

Where is it going?



- We have kept repair statistics since opening in July 2019
- Average number of items has grown from 20 to 30 per month
- Rough breakdown of results
 - · 60% of items fully repaired
 - 15% of items partially repaired/advice given
 - · 15% of items unable to be repaired
 - · 10% of items held over for next month
