Guest Speaker:

Bambi Gordon is the General Manager of Neighborhood Watch Victoria. She is also the administrator of the Warrandyte Business & Community Network Facebook page which she and a friend set up some time ago after Bambi and Greg moved to Warrandyte. She is now the sole administrator of this group which has over 22,105 members and is incredibly active. Bambi did not know anyone in the area so she thought it would be good way to connect with local people without having to actually physically go out and network or socialize.



The aim of Bambi's talk last week was to get us to think about ways we might attract new members to our club. The use of social media to advertise what we do and get the attention of prospective members is a very basic and necessary activity to increase our reach. She suggested we put up as many posts as we can to advertise our meetings and activities – with interesting short stories and photos which are better than long winded wording. This sounded very familiar – from advice from District Membership team over the years, but difficult in a club of older members who are not interested in social media. She suggested we outsource the social media to another younger group. Bambi is happy to give further advice about this. She also suggested we do a Community Survey using a method such as Survey Monkey.



Bambi also suggested we try to rope in volunteers in the hope that we can get them to help out with our various projects then join us as members. Volunteers can be sourced through social media if we put up interesting posts.

There was a bit to digest and some challenges for us.
