Regionalization Project:

The important issue for us to know about is a survey for all clubs to complete by the end of October –(this survey will need club discussion so it was decided to hold this at the next meeting on 10th October along with our guest speaker Ron Brooks who is a Rotarian so it should not be a problem for him). An email will be sent out shortly with the survey questions for all club members to ponder and respond prior to the meeting.

Main points re Regionalization so far:

- 1. There will be a regional council as the governing body across Zone 8.
- 2. There will be no Assistant Governors but there will be a Community Groups structure so the leadership roles will be more hands on than administrative.
- 3. Clusters as we know it will no longer exist but club will choose which Community group they join which suits their culture, interests and future plans.

Club Forum:

P.E. Rob Edwards conducted out club forum. The main topic was the Tunstall Market and how to continue under the current format with so few people to fill roles.

Bob McKenzie suggested that each club member choose a job which is their responsibility to fulful and if they are unable to attend a particular market they must find a replacement.
