After our meal we were introduced to Shane Harrop – Principal of Warrenwood Primary School.

Shane took us through a power point presentation which explained the way his school emphasizes well-being as well as learning. Students are encouraged to become leaders by the school having a number of leadership roles across all class levels. The children have experience in taking responsibility, mentoring and helping other students. The school has a team of wellbeing staff – two counsellors and a psychologist. Shane explained that

the school has had help from Geelong Grammar School which has invested a lot of money in research in how to improve students' emotional well-being – using the 10 below 10 above principle.

Shane thanked our club for its recent donation of \$4550 which will help 12 students who might have missed out otherwise, to attend an upcoming school camp in Canberra.

Shane then handed over to three of the four school captains who talked more about the way the school encourages leadership and uses the RUIn concept (Respect, Understanding, Integrity) to foster good relationships.



Students also have a wide range of learning experiences with the addition of the three specialist programs pictured on the slide.

The school also has an environmental program and each class elects two Greenologists whose job it is to sustain and look after the school environment.
